

Stafford Borough Development Plan

Stafford Borough has now published its draft development plan for the next 20 years. This involves building around 2200 new houses between Doxey and the Castle.

Play Space for Doxey's view

1. PS4D will not be taking a position on the desirability or otherwise of the housing plans but will be making submissions to the Borough in the following play related areas:
2. The Plan should provide additional recreational facilities which can be used by the present residents of Doxey as well as by the future residents of the area
3. That there should be **safe** foot and cycle paths to provide access from existing residential areas. This should eventually provide a proper cycle route from Doxey to the centre of Stafford.
4. It would be desirable if the Greenway was a 'spine' around which the major new recreation areas were provided. This would link the Rugby pitches, the Castlefields open space, the Castle View recreation area and the existing Football Pitch area with the more rural open spaces of Duddas Wood and the Millennium Green in Derrington. New playing fields and open space would then be part of a 2 mile 'green lung' accessible not only to the new housing but to other Stafford residents.

5. New open areas used by children should be easily visible from housing and well used paths, this will reduce the dangers of vandalism and bullying.

Doxey Parish Council's View

The Parish council are concerned that the infrastructure for such an ambitious plan should be in place and that facilities will be sufficient for the residents of the 3000 plus homes that will exist in the area. To this end they will be asking for:

1. Vehicle access is required through the proposed development linking Doxey's main road with the Newport Road, thus ensuring that all vehicles, emergency and otherwise, can gain access to this Parish and its residents well into the future.
2. A Village Parish Hall centrally will be a necessity once the new houses are built. This could then provide a secure facility from which to run keep fit classes, mum and toddler groups, and youth clubs. And be a place for Residents of the new, expanded Parish of Doxey to voice their concerns and coordinate local initiatives, making Doxey Parish both a vibrant and thriving community.
3. Preservation of our green spaces, football pitch and residents' rights of way towards the Greenway for both recreation, and as a means of accessing secondary education and Stafford Castle via the footpath.
4. Assurances that sewerage and drainage will be improved in a way that will not detrimentally affect the green spaces.
5. Amenities such as GP's surgery, chemists, dentist and an additional primary school.
