Life support project

This provides training in basic techniques for helping people in lifethreatening situations. These are where a person has collapsed and is unconscious or is choking. Training is provided by a team headed by a local doctor. There are three sessions you can attend.

Resuscitation of adults and older children Resuscitation of younger children and infants Helping someone who is choking and having difficulty breathing.

Each session lasts about two hours. Refreshments are provided.

Fifty people have taken part so far and 38 have done all three sessions. More sessions will be held as long as there is a demand for them. Call Joan on 251622 for details of dates and times.
